

9.0 Monitoring and Evaluation

One of the basic tenets of the planning process is that plans be continuously monitored and evaluated to ensure that current conditions and the Board's vision are accurately reflected. Monitoring must be continuous to ensure that improvement projects are timed appropriately in terms of relation to other projects, availability of funds, and capacity of public safety.

Each year the Board will make a report to the Township Board. The report will include the Authority's progress, including successes, failures, and other relevant information, using the benchmarks developed as a part of this Plan. This may be most appropriately timed with the budget cycle.

In addition to annual reporting, the Board will evaluate the Corridor Improvement Plan once every five years after adoption. The evaluation will include an assessment of Plan successes and failures, and list any findings and recommendations for adjustments. The Board may desire to hold a workshop with all property owners within the District to assist with evaluation of the Plan and to identify potential amendments.
